Adjacent Channel Interference

In all Montgomery County radio planning, careful attention is given to minimize radio interference on all radio channels. Most interference can be minimized through proper planning and engineering. However, in some cases, even where proper engineering has been employed, interference can be caused by equipment failure and/ or poor servicing techniques.

Concerning any or all Montgomery County radio sites and/or channels, Montgomery County is dedicated to the highest standards and performance that can be obtained in the industry. In the event of adjacent channel interference, or any type of interference which is caused radio equipment owned and maintained by Montgomery County, Montgomery County will correct the problem with its equipment or cease operation on that radio channel until the problem is resolved. If the interference cannot be remedied through normal techniques, and there is no equipment problem, Montgomery County will remove, re-license, and relocate the interfering radio channel to a new licensed physical location to resolve the problem and to adhere and conform to all standards approved in the NPSPAC Region 51 Plan.
