

1. The ledger was originally used for Mercantile Accounts dated January 1838 through March 1839. The Journal is in the first pages of the ledger and the individual accounts at the end of the bound book.
2. Docket numbers are not always by page. Some are multiple docket numbers on the same page.
3. When there are multiple there are multiple dockets with the same number, they have been designated as "a" and "b", etc.
4. Often Reeves does not name the sheriff, but simply refers to him by his title "Sheriff." If named at all, the sheriff is listed under costs.
5. Occasionally, there is a sheriff from another county. If so, he is so noted under the sheriff column.
6. There are 2 dockets that are designated as Precinct 4.
7. Also in the back of the book are several dockets that are not dated, numbered, and are otherwise missing information.
8. This docket is in poor physical condition and extremely brittle.
