

1. Both this docket and the one for Precinct 1, J. B. Reeves, J. P. are records of cases, i.e., minutes or journals.
 - a. Although the dockets are in numerical order, especially DeBajligethy, the dates are not. They can be from 1861 to 1868 to 1867 in sequential docket numbers.
 - b. The dates relate to the date of the original action not the date of the settlement.
 - c. Many of the cases have several continuances.
 - d. Several of the cases are not settled and transferred to the successor Justice Hanna
2. Pages numbered 381-384 are missing.
3. DeBajligethy minutes are very well organized. Each item – names, date, lawyers, etc., are basically in the same place and same order. It makes it very easy to index.
4. Docket 401 – These minutes are long enough that they needed an extra page. Someone glue the second page on to the top of page 401 rather than use a second page in the book.
5. Pages 406 & 407 are glued together
6. Pages 424 & 425 are glued together.
7. Pages 441 – 446 are glued together.
8. Pages 461 – 464 are missing.
9. Pages 467 – 478 are missing.
