

1. The JP Court Docket for G. W. Capron has its own index at the beginning of the book in numerical order by the docket number. This list has not been recopied since it is a duplication of the index created on Excel.
2. Page 25 contains a list of cash lent on August 1, 1857.
3. Case No. 14. – The abbreviation “Sci Fa” is the Latin phrase *scire Facias*. Definition: A writ requiring the party against which it is issued to appear and show cause why a judicial record should not be enforced, repealed, or annulled.
4. Where a sheriff is mentioned but no name given, the phrase “Sheriff of X County” is used to distinguish from the office of the constable.
5. Docket #171 & #172 between W. R. Wilson and R. W. Dowling appear to be duplicates.
6. Where G. W. Capron’s name is missing from the index is where he did not sign the docket.
7. Page 200 is titled “Houston August 8, 1857” and is a list of cash left on deposit from Sept 16 to March 1.
8. Page 201 is titled “August 8<sup>th</sup>, 1857” and is a list of cash withdrawals from August 12 to January 20.
9. Page 213 is a continuation of docket 180. There is no new information not represented in the original docket.
10. Page 223 – Dated July 10, 1872. Sale of property by bid for default on payment.
